Overview

During the second UG Diaspora conference in May 2023, it was agreed that the University of Guyana should move forward with the establishment of a Migration and Diaspora Research and Studies Centre. The International Centre for Migration and Diaspora Studies (MIDIAS) was launched on August 25th 2023 and is located at the Turkeyen Campus of the University of Guyana. MIDIAS promotes a supportive research and teaching environment for scholars concerned with issues of migration and diaspora, drawing on the skills and expertise of national and international academics, agencies, organizations and members of civil society. Furthermore, MIDIAS has an inclusive work agenda of key aspects of the dominant and sub-altern experiences of diasporas in the Caribbean and Latin America as well as in other parts of the world, including reciprocity, opportunities, business, culture, the specific roles and conditions of academics in the diaspora, women and gender, indigenous people, youth, the aged and those who may not be in the highest socio-economic strata in these countries.
